

# Ambulance: Land and Air Transportation

## Medical Policy

### *Utilization Management*

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#### I. **DEFINITION:**

An **ambulance** is a specially equipped vehicle (i.e., automobile, boat, airplane, or helicopter) designed and supplied with materials and devices to provide life-saving and supportive treatments or interventions while transporting the sick or injured and has the appropriate staff aboard to provide medical care, if necessary.

**Inter-hospital transfers** are the process of discharging a patient from one hospital inpatient stay or Emergency Department (ED) to another hospital that results in an admission to the second hospital.

#### II. **MEDICARE ADVANTAGE PLANS:**

Prior authorization is required for non-emergent medical transportation and air/helicopter hospital to hospital transport.

Submit a request through the MyAdvocate Medicare Advantage provider portal.

**Call MyAdvocate Medicare Advantage at 1-800-991-8109 to request prior authorization for any non-emergency transportation or if the nearest facility is not able to provide the needed level of care and transportation is to a facility further away.**
